

Meet your neighbors...there are over 3,800 species of wildlife that call Kentucky home and 727 species are identified as either endangered, threatened or of special concern. The Kentucky Heritage Land Conservation Fund helps state agencies, local governments, colleges, universities, and other public agencies protect their habitats by purchasing land. This land is open to the public for hiking, paddling, and enjoying nature!

When you buy a *"Nature's Finest"* license plate, the money from that sale goes into the **Kentucky Heritage Land Conservation Fund**. Those funds are then used for purchasing natural areas that are to be left as protected places, held in trust for future generations to enjoy. Since the program began in 1995, Kentuckians have contributed more than \$10 million dollars and have saved over 76,000 acres of natural areas that people treasure and wildlife call home.

## How to get a “*Nature’s Finest*”


### license plate:

If you are registering a new or out-of-state vehicle in Kentucky, request a “*Nature’s Finest*” license plate from your county clerk or motor vehicle dealer at time of purchase. If you lease in Kentucky, offer your leasing company a check for the extra charge of \$10 to get the “*Nature’s Finest*” license plate. If you are converting from a different plate, turn in your regular plate at your local county clerk’s office and you will be given credit for the months remaining on your decal.





## How much does the “*Nature’s Finest*” license plate cost?

The annual cost is \$10 above the cost of a regular license plate and is considered a tax-deductible donation to Kentucky Heritage Land Conservation Fund. It is used to purchase land from willing sellers for nature preserves, state parks, forests, wildlife management areas, recreation, environmental education areas, wild river corridors and wetlands.


